Velkomin welcome

The Icelandic Festival of Manitoba – Islendingadagurinn, is the oldest continuous ethnic festival in Canada, attracting approx. 50,000 festival-goers over a four-day period, every August long weekend. Islendingadagurinn is a volunteer organization, dedicated to promoting and sustaining interest in Icelandic culture and heritage, primarily through an annual festival celebration.

Manitoba is home to the largest settlement of Icelanders outside of Iceland, with over 31,000 Icelanders or Vestur-Íslendingar (West Icelanders).

The festival takes place in the heart of "New Iceland," in the town of Gimli, Manitoba. The Icelandic Festival has received the "STAR Celebration" designation from the Provincial Tourism Secretariat and earned a spot in the 2015 American Bus Association's "Top 100 North American Events and Festivals." We were named "Event of the Year, over \$5,000," at the 18th annual Manitoba Tourism Awards.

Islendingadagurinn has an international reputation as one of the finest Icelandic celebrations, and is covered by media from all over the world.

Each year we welcome a delegation from Iceland that has included Presidents, Prime Ministers, Diplomats, Ministers, Government Officials, artists, musicians, writers and poets. They are joined by their Canadian counterparts. This meeting of countries, to facilitate international cooperation, is central to our festival.

The Icelandic Festival hosts a Viking Village, next to beautiful Viking Park and Lake Winnipeg, which replicates a Viking settlement circa 900 AD.

Re-enactors live, eat, sleep and dress as Vikings, and showcase their warfare, leather tooling, carving and wool skills while thrilling audiences with Icelandic tales and legends. In true Viking spirit they demonstrate combat skills and weapons during a daily battle.

Brilliant beaches host a family sandcastle building contest, beach volleyball tournament, and Islendingadunk, an event where two friendly combatants use padded poles to try to knock each other off of a greased beam extended over the harbour water. The harbour area features cold drinks at Vingólf Beverage Gardens and a variety of food and craft vendors.

Gimli Park is home to the midway, family sport events and is the headquarters for the 5 Kilometre, 10 Mile and 1 Mile running races. Festival-goers can also try their hand at Fris-Nok, a sport where participants try to knock a bottle off their opposing teams post using a Frisbee. Icelandic culture and talent is celebrated through our annual Poetry and Short Story content, at the Cultural Pavilion and the Icelandic Fashion Show. Traditional Icelandic food is available at Amma's Kitchen. Free – live music and entertainment is featured all weekend long, including an impressive fireworks display over Lake Winnipeg.

We host one of the largest parades in rural Manitoba, and a traditional program built around the coming together of Icelandic delegations, led by our Fjallkona (the festival queen and female embodiment of Iceland). We welcome people of all ages and backgrounds to come celebrate Icelandic culture and heritage with us and unleash their inner Viking.

Sponsor support helps us to keep festival events free to low cost for years to come and ensure that future generations can keep the Icelandic spirit alive.
